Endemic. Three Kings, North and South Islands. In the South Island generally scarce reaching its southern limit at Eyrewell Forest, Canterbury

Habitat:

Usually coastal and lowland open shrublands, gumland scrub and in sand country. Also in rocky headlands. occasionally found well inland in montane situations. A species virtually confined to successional vegetation types


