Urtica ferox

Common Name(s):

Ongaonga, tree nettle

Current Threat Status (2012):

Not Threatened

Distribution:

Endemic. Found throughout NZ in North and South Islands reaching Otago as its southern limit.

Habitat:

Common in the fringes of bushland. Mainly found in coastal and lowland forest margins and shrublands.

Features:

The shrub stands up to 2 m tall with a base up to 12 cm diameter. Its leaves are pale green, $8-12 \times 3-5$ cm that are borne on petioles up to 5 cm long.

Flowering: Fruiting:

November - March December - May

Threats:

Not Threatened
