Not Threatened

Distribution:

Endemic. North Island from Te Paki south to about Kawhia and the Kaimai Ranges.

Flowering: Fruiting:

October - December - Movember - March

Threats:

Not Threatened - but may qualify as Data Deficient because its exact distribution and abundance remain unclear due to past confusion with *Caladenia chlorostyla*.
