Acacia baileyana

Common Name(s):

Cootamundra wattle

Current Threat Status (2009):

Exotic

Habitat:

Waste places and scrubland.

Features:

Small to fairly large tree with bipinnate glaucous leaves. The cultivated variety "purpurea" is also widely grown, this has purpletinged leaves but is not known to be naturalised. Flowers consist of numerous globbose mid-yellow heads in racemes exceeding the leaves. The seed pod is more or less straight, up to 100 x 20 mm.

Flowering:

June, July, August.
