



Acacia elata

Common Name(s):

cedar wattle

Current Threat Status (2009):

Exotic

Habitat:

Prefers moist areas, streamsides etc.

Features:

Small to large tree with ribbed stems. Leaves 2-pinnate, pinnae in 2-5 pairs, Pinules widely spaced and green. Inflorescence consists of numerous pale yellow globose heads arranged in racemes. Seed pod up to 150 x 15 mm.

Flowering:

February, March
