Alnus viridis

Common Name(s):

green alder

Current Threat Status (2009):

Exotic

Habitat:

Terrestrial. High country slopes and screes.

Features:

Multi-stemmed shrub to about 2 m tending to layer. Broadly ovate leaves to about 7×6 cm with irregular serrate margins held on petioles of 1-2 cm. Male and female catkins borne separately, but on the same plant. Male catkins 3-6 cm long in clusters of up to 3 at shoot apicies. Female catkins in loose racemes of up to 6. Seed about 2 mm long, broadly ellipsoid and winged.

Flowering:

October, November
