Canna indica

Common Name(s):

Indian shot

Current Threat Status (2009):

Exotic

Habitat:

Terrestrial. Damp spots, wetlands, low-growing habitats, disturbed shrubland, streamsides, riversystems.

Features:

Erect, leafy perennial herb to 1-2 m tall. Roots rhizomatous. Stem sturdy, unbranched, hairless. Leaves on the stem, to 45×15 cm, oblong, with prominent midrib, sheath below. Flowers often paired, 5-6 cm long, pinkish-red and reddish-yellow, with red spots. Seed capsule round, to 2 cm, with black seeds.

Flowering:

November, December, February, March, April

Fruiting:

January, March, April, May
