



Sarcosoma orientale

Common Name(s):

None

Distribution:

Taupo, Stewart Island, Vietnam, Indonesia.

Features:

The fruiting body consists of a large, thick disc, up to 10 cm diameter, and narrowly attached at the centre. It is flabby and jelly-like, and heavy to hold. The upper surface is smooth while the lower surface is even or wrinkled. It is black beneath, bright orange-brown or apricot above, dark grey within. The spores are colourless, ellipsoidal, 42–50 x 16–18 μm , and verrucose.

Fruiting:

Known from two collection made in April and August.
