Hygrophila angustifolia

Distribution:

Only known from one site at Western Springs, Auckland, but a common plant in the aquarium trade.

Habitat:

Still and slow flowing shallow water bodies.

Features*:

Erect herb, decumbent with age, usually 50-100 cm high, mostly glabrous; branches 4-angled. Leaves linear to lanceolate, mostly 2.5-16 cm long, 2-8 mm wide, apex \pm obtuse, base attenuate, margins entire and sometimes undulate, glabrous or sparsely hairy; \pm sessile. Axillary clusters of 2-12-flowered; flowers sessile; bracts 2-7 mm long. Calyx 8-10 mm long. Corolla blue, mauve or more usually white with darker markings; tube 6-8 mm long; lobes 3-4 mm long.

Flowering:

Late summer (March)
