

Wanganui Plant List No. 149

Forest remnant beside tributary of Kai Iwi Stream, off Smith Road, southeast of Kai Iwi, Wanganui

The forest appears to follow about 3 km of valleys (2 forks of one valley system); our survey was of less than 0.5 km, at about grid ref R22/756473. Stock have access to the forest throughout. Titoki and mahoe are the dominant trees, with *Coprosma areolata* and kawakawa as common understorey shrubs; climbing blechnum is the most common ground cover. The narrow valley floor has some swampy areas with *Carex virgata* common where there is little overhead forest.

Most of the species recorded are common in forest remnants of the district, except for two species, a fern and a sedge. The maidenhair fern, *Adiantum viridescens* and a tufted grass-like sedge *Carex spinirostris*, are quite rare in the district. *A. viridescens* has one other record from near Wanganui, near Lake Wiritoa, then the next-nearest are from the Jerusalem-Pipiriki area, the Ruahine Range and North Taranaki. *C. spinirostris* has been found twice near Wanganui (St John's Hill Green Belt, and at Brunswick) then Taranaki and Palmerston North, Manawatu Gorge and Ruahine Range. Both species grow on dry banks in forest.
